PASTOR JOHN'S THOUGHTS

I found a two-cd album at a thrift store last week that caught my eye. It set me back \$50c. The title is WJTL UNITE: 34 of the area's best Christian Artists. There are seventeen offerings on each of the two discs. The second cut on the second disc spoke to me in a big way. It was recorded in 1998 by a group called RiverEdge, who also produced the lyrics and music. The title is Moths Can Not Destroy This. Here are the lyrics, beginning with the chorus which is repeated after the verses:

Praise God, He died and saved me And I'm gonna serve Him till the end Praise God, He's made a place for me And I'm gonna be there with my friends

No, I'm sorry I cannot go out for I have better things to do Please don't get me wrong I enjoy the time that I spend with you But I must spend time with my Lord For I must keep my treasure stored

I cannot wait to see His face No crying there, not in that place

Eat and drink and merriment that's all that a lot of people do But food and wine is worthless if it's lasting treasure that you would pursue And I want faith like a little boy What I have gained, moths cannot destroy

It's a song about heaven, and laying up treasure there instead of on this earth. The chorus speaks powerfully of what God in Christ has done to make it possible for each of us to go there. It is through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus for all of us, that we will soon be celebrating in Holy Week, as we do throughout the calendar year. Our Savior lived a perfect life as a sinless human being wholly dependent on the Holy Spirit and submitted to the will of his heavenly Father. He arrived at the cross totally qualified to bear the sin of all humanity in his body laid down for us. REFLECTIONS

Some Thoughts About the Word, Old

We often misuse words just because they seem right. For example, people at MO are used to calling the Covenanter Church the Old Church. In a way that is correct, it is old. It is the oldest Covenanter Church in North America. However, if you use the term to mean older than MO, it is not correct.

The Covenanters bought the land from MO in 1753 and built their church in 1754. That building was taken down in 1849 and rebuilt with a new design. MO Church was founded in 1727, and the main part of the church building that we worship in today was built about 1790. So, the congregation and the church at MO are older than the Covenanter congregation and their church building.

In another context, we often use the expression, "Old Folks". If used correctly, the expression should refer to age, but even that is difficult to pin down. At what age are you old? Are you expected to feel and act different when you reach that magic age? When does middle age turn to old age? As you age, why do we remember yesteryear more clearly than we remember what happened yesterday?

Statistics tell us that more people than ever before are living to age 100, yet mortality rates for children are high in some parts of the county including the Amish in our area. Modern medicine has many benefits if you can afford it and if you are not a vaccine denier.

Many questions, few answers. What is clear, old should not carry with it any stereotype which labels folks as useless or even inferior to the younger set. Genetics offers hope that we may at least live as long as our ancestors, but that can be advanced or reduced by lifestyle. We all know the truth, only the Lord knows when and why we pass away. However, this reality should not be used as an excuse to lead a slovenly life.


