
MIDDLE OCTORARA PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH June 2025 NEWSLETTER

PASTOR JOHN'S THOUGHTS

In his book, <u>Mere Christianity</u>, C. S. Lewis compares the result of having Christ in our lives to having salt on food. "Far from killing the taste of the egg, the tripe, and the cabbage," he writes, "it actually brings it out. They do not show their real taste until you've added the salt. It is something like that with Christ and us. The more we get what we now call ourselves out of the way, and let him take us over, the more truly we become ourselves. In that sense, our real selves are all waiting for us in him."

The world defines freedom and self-fulfillment as doing what we want. God defines it as just the opposite: living for him and for others at his direction. Reference the two great commandments: loving God with our whole selves (heart, soul, mind, and strength) and our neighbors as ourselves. Or even better, reference the one great commandment: loving others as Christ has first loved us. The Apostle Paul says in Galatians 5:1,13, "It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Do not use your freedom to indulge your sinful nature; rather, serve one another in love." God created us in love, for love, to serve him and others with all that he has built into us. He is in the process of redeeming us in Christ, saving us from sin and self, restoring us to our original purpose.

It doesn't happen overnight. It takes a lifetime. But it is the best pursuit any of us can have, dying to self more and more, and trusting Jesus, our Lord and Savior, to live in us. We all have differing gifts to share, we all have different spheres of influence, people whose lives God wants us to impact for him. I continue to be amazed and delighted by the many food flavors God is bringing out through the salt of the gospel, and the powerful ways MO is acting as light and salt in the world. I am blessed to be your pastor.

I Resent Being Written Off

A Prostate-Specific Antigen (PSA) blood test is used to detect prostate cancer or an enlarged prostate. Results are reported in numbers – the lower the better. A high number results in having a biopsy of the prostate as a second check for cancer. I have been through that process three times with no positive results, although on one occasion Lancaster General wasn't sure, so they sent the specimen to John Hopkins for confirmation. In my seventies, I accepted the following statements as truth. By your seventies you do not need a PSA test. If you develop prostate cancer, a slow growing cancer, something else will probably kill you before the prostate cancer does.

Therefore, I was shocked to learn that former President Biden, a man three years younger than I, has aggressive prostate cancer that has already spread to his bones. I was even more shocked to learn that he had not had a PSA for eleven years, in spite of a family history of cancer. I always thought that the presidents got the best of medical advice and care.

I resent being written off based on a myth accepted as a truth. Even if that myth is true for a high percent of people, it is still a lie. In my case, it would be a shame to die of prostate cancer after surviving several other serious medical problems.

Thus I called my Urologist and demanded a PSA. I had the test today, May 28. The result was well within the acceptable level. Wonderful! Am I paranoid? Probably, but that is how I manage my healthcare.
